#### \*\*\*\*\* M & L STATIONARY ENGINE MAGNETOS - MCK & CK TYPES \*\*\*\*\*

These magnetos are specifically designed to suit Lister stationary engines and are of the fixed ignition type of machine, the CK being used on the large engines and the MCK on smaller models such as the Lister A and B types. The magnetos are similar in design and most of the spare parts and interchangeable between them. The main difference is that a more powerful magnetic system is used on the CK machines. The units are in all cases driven at engine speed, giving an idle spark on the exhaust stroke. This arrangement helps starting considerably. The idle spark has the effect of keeping the plug electrodes clean. The magnets on both magnetos are made from cobalt steel this being about four times more powerful that tungsten steel magnets. Timing the magnetos should it be necessary to re-time the magneto the drive sprocket must be loosened on the tapered spindle and the nut tightened up with the fingers so that the sprocket is just gripped to the spindle. Next turn the engine until the timing marks are lined up, place the magneto in its platform with the chain on the sprocket and insert the fixing bolts. Turn the magneto armature round by means of the contact breaker in the direction in which it rotates normally, until the contact breaker points just start to open, taking care of course that the engine is not rotated. Then lightly tap the sprocket onto the tapered spindle and tighten the sprocket fixing nut or screw, taking great care that the armature is not rotated in the process. All this should leave the magneto correctly timed, but do check by turning the engine over once again and realigning the timing marks on the engine and then checking the contact breaker points they should be just opening. Although a magneto should never e dismantled unnecessarily, a little attention from time to time will be found worthwhile, this attention may be summed up in three words cleanliness, adjustment and lubrication. So keep it clean, adjust the points to the correct gap and add a little oil to the contact breaker cam and the pivot arm if dry. One tip - never detach the high tension cable by pulling it out of the pick up terminal when the engine is running, this will damage the insulation and cause breakdown of the magneto.
