We are now well into the 2025 rally season, I have already got into gear and visited my first few events starting with Keith & Will Millers show at Top Field Bratton, this is always a very nice way to start the years events, a nice friendly show more like they were way back in the early eighties. Next stop was the Lambourn Show on Sunday the 4th May, I have been going to Lambourn for more times than I can remember, a wonderful one day show where they get huge amounts of people through the gate, they had a few more engines than last year but there is still room for more so again if you have never exhibited at Lambourn you have missed out on a very good event, I took my friend and long time club member Bob Hallam with me and he had never been before, he thought it was a great day out and really enjoyed the day.

ABBEY HILL STEAM RALLY



I wasn't too fussed about going to Abbey Hill this year, but as usual, I couldn't resist and entered an engine.

It was too good an opportunity for the twin Petter S Type engine to give it it's maiden outing at a Yeovil show – so that's what I took along. I could only attend the Saturday as I was elsewhere on the Sunday and Monday but it was good to be left a decent space on the line to be able to drop off the lump of an engine it is, with no steering, where it comes off the trailer is where it stays, there is simply no moving it after.

Soon we had it levelled up and ready to start, as the blowtorches roared away a small crowd gathered.....as they do! A few winds on the lubricator drive, top up the oil wells and give everything a squirt of oil and it was time to give her a shot of air. NOPE! She wasn't having anything first time......but after a couple of goes, away it went and steadied down to a slow idle. This was it's first run with a water tank – albeit too small for continuous running, it gave the engine time to get a good bit of heat into it and run for a good while. Adjustment of the top water pipe is needed to suit the tank, so I'll do that and try it again.

A few jobs to do after a few hours running, I do need to adjust the Madison-Kipp oiler as I think it is over-oiling the cylinders slightly, my sincere apologies must go to Mark Langmead and Pete Gear for giving their vehicles a slight covering of 'Petter rain'!! All in all, I was very happy with how it performed.

Talking to the steward (who did a great job) I think there were 193 engines entered and 188 were on site – it was nice to see most of the field taken up with engines of all sorts running. Next year we need to get the lighting display along the road back, this was always good in previous years, so if you've got a lighting set, I think you'd be very welcome next year. *David*
