We had a very nice display of vintage oil cans from Ken Barnett and one commercial vehicle, a 1942 Commer. Tony Champney brought along his Trustysteed tractor.

As usual, we held a raffle with donations to the Alzheimer's Society – thanks to Carol Phillips efforts, we raised £85.
