Chairman's Report, January/February 2019

Monday 28th February, Annual General Meeting of the Wessex Stationary Engine Club Ltd. Committee Members in attendance, Mr Roy Sandford, Mr Gary Sainsbury, Mr Herb Gane, Mr Brian Coles, Mr Gordon Guley. Executive committee members in attendance, E Gay - Chairman, Tony Lawrence - vice chairman, Mrs Karen Gumm - treasurer, Mr Ted Edwards - secretary, Apologies for absence received from Ted Durbin, Roger & Linda Pike and Mary Verrall.

The meeting was opened at 20.05 by myself acting for our president at his request.

Minutes of the 2018 AGM were read by our secretary Mr Ted Edwards.

Matters arising: There was a discussion of AOB in so much that a charge should be made to visitors to our meeting, I explained that I welcome visitors as this brought income to the Old Down Inn, and in so doing this in turn helped us as a club keep access to our Free Room at The Old Down Inn. My thanks must go to Ted for brilliant work, not only as a secretary for the WSEC but also as secretary to the WMVS and his help and advice in setting the clubs new web site deserves our sincere thanks.

The Wessex website works, never before have I received so many enquiries as I do now.

February 2018 saw our long time editor Karen stand aside from this job, I felt very sad when Karen had to give up being our editor of the newsletter. Karen had done a wonderful job not only as editor, but collecting the news letter from the printer in Frome and taking it to her mum in Hilperton for distribution.

Help though was at hand. Into the breach stepped Sacha Swinden-Pride. My sincere thanks goes to Sacha for taking on the task, not easy when one has two jobs and a family to look after, with a hundred and one other things life throws at one from time to time.

I very much hope that you have all looked at our list of events for 2019, the committee works very hard to plan all this. Please, if you can, give the events your support.

The very worst news that I had in 2018 was the fact that Karen has to stand down as Treasurer, we are so very sorry to lose her. I myself cannot thank her enough for all the hard work and dedication she has given to the Wessex Stationary Engine Club, Karen is still going to look after the end of year accounts and deal with Companies House. Myself and the committee thank her so very much for agreeing to do this for us.

I hope that in the near future we may have someone to take over keeping the day to day records for the WSEC.

On behalf of myself and the committee to express my own and the committees sincere thanks for all that you have done for us over the past years and for putting up with me, and all the help and advice given to me on many occasions.

Last but by no means least our sincere thanks goes to Jackie Coles for her hard work and help, nothing was ever to much for Jackie and her cheerfulness was a joy that I for one will miss. From all your friends on the committee thank you so much and we, all hope your health gets better in the near future.

This ends the Chairman's report.

Treasurers Report: Karen Gumm reported that the club had made a loss of £755, down £1950 from the previous year, with a small amount still to come in. The end of year balance was £13,667, down £1163 due partly to lower membership, down from 221 to 213 and reduced income from the show, down £1173, with attendance being 100 down on previous years and an increase in costs, mainly for improved toilets.

Wedmore brought in £182 for Alzheimers, Westbury £66. The increase of £290 in club costs was mainly due to an increase in postal charges, which are due to go up again shortly. The full details of the accounts will be printed in the newsletter in due course.

Presentations: Presentations were made by myself to Wendy Gane and members of the executive. I on behalf of the committee presented a bouquet of flowers to Karen, I myself was presented with the editor's cup by Karen, and the club gave a presentation to our host at the Old Down Inn, Maxine.

Election of officers: All committee members with the exception of Karen Gumm stood for re-election, all were re-elected by votes from the attending members and postal votes.

Mr Gordon Guley asked what was being done in regards to the post of treasurer, at this time all committee members would be responsible for the club records and finance up until a new treasurer can be found. After a question from the floor about Wendy Gane's position as Membership Secretary, Wendy agreed that she would continue in the post.

Presidents Address: In the absence of our President, I read Roger's address. 2018 was a very busy season for us all and very successful year for the club. The event held at Whaddon Lane suffered as we had a heavy snow fall, hopefully it will not suffer the same fate in 2019 (March 18th). The club rally organisation is well under way, but as usual we would welcome more help.

I am personally surprised of the lack of response to items announced in the Newsletter. Eric tried to get a Christmas party in place this year, he never had a phone call except one. With some 200 + members this was not good, resulting in it not happening, which was a great shame as last years was such a success. It is

hard work and a lot of time for these different events to take place. It's your club, your events, your rally SO PLEASE GIVE THE COMMITTEE YOUR SUPPORT. Here's to a happy healthy and safe 2019.

AOB: Mr Gary Sainsbury said that he had downloaded a 2018 rally entry form, how could this be? The committee were unable to give a firm reply to this, all forms on the new web site are current for 2019. Our old website is inaccessible.

The question was raised concerning the miniature Traction engine we were offered in 2016, this was never a concern of the Wessex Stationary Engine Club Ltd, as we never took on the offer of this engine in any way.

The question raised by Mr Gordon Guley concerning the newsletter was dealt with and is being proof read by Ted. The newsletter is in safe hands being edited by Sacha and now Sacha is taking on not only editing but also distributing the newsletter, (please help if you can receive your copy by email, please contact Ted. This will save the Club Money).

There was a discussion by club members and the committee that we need some younger members in our ranks.

With no other business the meeting was closed at 21-30.

Looking Back (Part 4) Cont.

The 8Hp AP Ruston Hornsby was collected by Bill and myself from Devon and brought back to Frome on a plant trailer that Bill had borrowed from his works, off loaded then gently rolled on 4ft scaffold tubes into the garage for restoration. During the winter months we fabricated a purpose built trailer which was supported on a Ford transit rear axle and springs and when completed we parked it up in an old redundant sub-stn that I rented off the SEB. The trailer never stayed there long as the locks were cut from the gates and the trailer was stolen. So for us it was what to do next? By chance I located an ex Water Board trailer that was identical to the ones we used at work with our O/H line teams, and with the two long lids removed and the sides cut down to bed level it was just the job as it could carry about a ton (the Engine was 13cwt).

When we started restoring the engine there was very little to do. The Wico EK mag had a good spark and with every moving part well lubricated we soon had it up and running, It had two fuel tanks, one for petrol and a larger one for paraffin, and after warming up on petrol it ran very well on para. Bill noticed the crank shaft bearings had a bit of wear so we whipped them out and took them to a local engineer that did a lot of work for Bill's firm and he soon had them back to perfection, but he did ask us to provide him with the white metal in stick form about 18 ins long and the thickness of a thin pencil.

This made us look up the white metal recipe and as near as we could get to it was tip into the melting pot several one inch wide sticks of grade "D" plumbing metal, a few sticks of tinmans solder and I think it was some antimony. When all this was fluid in the pot and not over heated we used a large ladle to scoop out and gently pour into an upturned heated length of 1 inch angle iron, and when set the sticks were tipped out. In possession of the sticks of metal the engineer then gas welded slowly the metal onto the bearing shells leaving them looking like a Nux bar, then clamping the shells together in his lathe machined them out to the tolerances' required and left the final fitting to us with hand scrapers .
