I always look forward to Mells daffodil Day which is always held on Easter Monday in the very beautiful village of Mells, Nr Frome as it is always the first crank-up of the new season. It is aptly named 'Daffodil Day' because thousands of daffodils and narcissi are planted all around the village. The village is closed off to traffic except for access to several car parks. The streets of the village are filled with market traders, food vendors, charity stalls etc. all trying to get the 10,000 people who descend on the village to part with their money. The Talbot Inn is open all day and is jammed solid with thirsty customers, the church is nicely decorated and is open for people to visit. A competition is held for Town Criers, and their loud voices can be heard all over the village. A medieval battle is reenacted and the roar of their cannons fair shook the village, and it certainly frightened Mary Verralls Jack Russell (Ben) and Alan Vicary's Billie. It is surprising how long it take to clean and prepare an engine ready for a rally when it has been unused all the winter. The same applies to my Transit van which has been unused since last years rallies. However I got it ready and set off for Mells. On arriving I was surprised to see so many engines already there and set up. I was lucky to find a spot well away from a certain 'smoky' steam engine, the owner who will remain anonymous, 'ha ha' sorry Robin. A very good selection of engines were on display including three large Rustons. Bill Appleby had his big Ruston and generator, Arthur Smith bought his recent acquisition, a very large trailer mounted Ruston - I think we will see more of this one in the future, it certainly ran extremely well. Also Phil Marshall has just bought a Ruston I.P. what a superb engine this was, a very good example of British engineering at its best. About 40 engines were exhibited ranging from the big Rustons to a very small Teagle exhibited for the first time by Junior member Jonathon Hockedy of Frome. Colin Nicholson won an award for the best engine exhibited with his trailer mounted Lister A and pumping set, well done Colin. We found it a good opportunity to advertise our rally, I gave an entry form to every trader in the street market area, and Ray gave every classic car, commercial and military vehicles and entry form. I hope it will bear fruit. The weather stayed dry all day, in fact in the afternoon it was quite sunny and warm. All to soon it was time to load up and depart. The engine will now stay in the van until the crank-up at Nunney, now only two weeks away. Many thanks to Robin for organising the Mells and Nunney events.

# \*\*\*\* MEMBERS EVENING - 29TH MARCH, 1999 \*\*\*\*\* \*\*\*\* A VISIT FROM RICHARD BUFFREY OF LISTER PETTER \*\*\*\*\*

The Lister family originated from the West riding of Yorkshire. James Lister came from the small village of Haworth and was soon to become the High Sheriff of Yorkshire. His son George moved to the Cotswolds in 1817. His son Robert Aston Lister who was born on 4th February 1845 founded the building we all know as Listers RA in 1867. He fortunately like many of the Lister family married wealthy ladies of the time which helped enormously when money was at a premium as was in those days. The first diesel engine was developed in 1929 and the first lawn-mower was also born in the Stroud valley. Items made at the company have included sheep shears, rake, milk coolers, shell cases, garden furniture, waste bins, garden tubs, road signs and railway signs. The company laid on their own transport busing people from outlying areas of Gloucestershire to work at the factory. The company also owned much of the housing in the Stroud area which was rented out to their employees. The company had grown and grown with the industrial revolution but they have not been without disaster when in 1983 there was a huge fire at the factory which involved millions of pounds. In its heyday around 1958 the company employed over 3,500 people. Today around 55% of the company are now making components for outside organisations but it is on the road to survival with the inevitable cutbacks made on employees over the last few years. Richard showed an old 1940 8mm film made for the Lister company showing 600 employees all receiving their 25 year long service certificates. The whole of the company were invited to a special day out with fairground rides and parades through the town. There have been many famous faces who have visited the factory including two visits from Queen Mary, Princess Anne, Prince Michael of Kent and Donald Campbell. Copies of their signatures from the Visitors book were displayed. Another film included the 1955 Bath & West show held in Devon with which the company had been involved. A miniature power station was erected and with the help of a lady water diviner their own water supply was laid on. It has overcome many re-organisations and is now unfortunately owned by a finance company at present but with a new 'lady' at the helm it is now anticipated that things will be on the up once again. It is hoped that the investments the company are making now will help keep the company going in the next millenium. Another evening visit to the factory is being organised in the near future and hopefully the new Museum that the company are hoping to put together will also be ready for visitors to see.






Fig. 16.—Where to Look for Trouble in a Magneto Ignition System. (Pictorial diagram.) See also Fig. 17.




Fig. 17.—Where to Look for Trouble in a Magneto Ignition System. (Technical diagram.) To be studied in conjunction with Fig. 16
