TAPPETS TEA-TIME TEASERS – ANSWERS

- 1. **25,000 miles**. The equatorial circumference of Earth is about 24,901 miles (40,075 km). However, from pole-to-pole the meridional circumference Earth is only 24,860 miles (40,008 km) around. This shape, caused by the flattening at the poles, is called an oblate spheroid.
- 2. **Great Expectations**. Philip Pirrip, called Pip, is the protagonist and narrator in Charles Dickens's novel Great Expectations (1861).
- 3. **1918**. On 11 September 1918, Ruston, Proctor and Company merged with <u>Richard Hornsby & Sons</u> of <u>Grantham</u> to become **Ruston and Hornsby Ltd** (R&H). Hornsby was the world leader in <u>heavy oil engines</u>, having been building them since 1891, a full eight years before <u>Rudolph Diesel</u>'s engine was produced commercially.
- 4. **15cm**. The Eiffel Tower can grow up to 15 centimetres taller during hot Parisian summer days. This is because of "thermal expansion." When an object is heated, its particles gain kinetic energy, move faster, and take up more space.
- 5. **William IV** (William Henry; 21 August 1765 20 June 1837) was <u>King of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland</u> and <u>King of Hanover</u> from 26 June 1830 until his death in 1837. The third son of <u>George III</u>, William succeeded his elder brother <u>George IV</u>, becoming the last king and penultimate monarch of Britain's <u>House of Hanover</u>. William was succeeded by his niece <u>Queen Victoria</u>.
- 6. **195**. Since South Sudan became an independent state on 9 July 2011, there are now 195 independent sovereign nations in the world (not including the disputed but de facto independent Taiwan), plus some 60 dependent areas, and several disputed territories, like Kosovo.
- 7. **1903 at the Royal Bath and West Agricultural Show**. In 1902, competition increased from Fairbanks Morse's "Jack of all Trades" vertical T.V.O. engines, so Petter responded with another redesign, which produced a cheaper engine called the "Handyman," offered in five sizes. When this engine was first shown publicly in 1903 at the Royal Bath and West Agricultural Show, a U.S. firm negotiated the wholesale rights and ordered 400 engines.
- 8. **7**. After winning the 2020 season, Hamilton equalled Michael Schumacher's record of seven Formula 1 World Championships. Lewis Hamilton's win at the Turkish Grand Prix secured his seventh championship after previous successes in 2008, 2014, 2015, 2017, 2018 and 2019.
- 9. **26.29m**. The longest motorcycle is 26.29 m (86 ft 3 in) long and was created by Bharat Sinh Parmar (India). It was presented and measured at Lakhota lake, Jamnagar, Gujarat, India, on 22 January 2014. Bharat's bike is more than 4 m (13 ft) longer than the previous record holder's.
- 10. **52**. There will be 52 legs in total. Horses = 8, cows = 16, chickens = 22, dog = 4, farmer = 2

READY-RECKONER – ENGINE RPM

A rule of thumb method for finding the rpm of a normal four stroke engine. Count the number of times it fires in six seconds, double it then add a nought.

For example: say it fires 12 times, double it, 24 add a nought 240 then that's the rpm. John Emery
