WEST SOMERSET RAILWAY RALLY REPORT

The weekend of the 6th and 7th August 2022 saw the return of the popular West Somerset Railway steam and vintage vehicle rally.

I undertook the job as steward in winter 2020, but unfortunately the 2020 and the 2021 shows never happened due to the dreaded pandemic.

With 2022 looking much more promising, plans to hold the rally were made, weeks leading up to the show were blessed with fine dry warm weather and the weekend was bright hot sunshine, fortunately this did not put off the visitors as record numbers arrived at the gates.

During the planning meetings some concerns were raised about the stationary engine section being a bit stale and uninviting, we made a few changes; one was to remove the camping from behind the engine line up to improve the display. We also introduced a Saturday evening light up. This encouraged lighting sets and generators to run into the evening, the Friday night especially so when the train drew up bringing passengers back to site from the Watchet excursion for chips and a few pints!

Both ideas were very successful and many positive comments on how good the section looked.

Among the engines, there were two rare W.H. Pool and Sons oil Engines, these engines were blacksmith made just 12 miles from the show site. Another interesting engine was Murray Bishop's Robson Diesel Engine, this had just been removed from a scrap yard and requires extensive work, the engine seemed to cause more interest than a running engine.

A larger engine on display was the first outing for my own Ruston Hornsby 6XHR 32HP, this engine was removed from Saltmoor pumping station on the Somerset levels, over the last few years been mounted on a trailer. the engine ran very well and caused a lot of interest.
